



PLAYING RULES

The Official Rules of ASA shall be used with the following exceptions.

The team listed on the top of the bracket will occupy the first base dugout.

Umpires will conduct a coin flip at the pregame meeting to determine the home team.

Teams will be allowed to bat their line-ups with the following conditions:

1. Players may leave and reenter the batting order as many times as desired.
2. They must reenter in the same position in the batting order they occupied previously.
3. Courtesy Runners may be used for the pitcher and catcher.
 - A. If not batting the line-up the courtesy runner must be a player on the bench that has not previously been in the game. The same Courtesy Runner may run for both the pitcher and catcher.
 - B. If batting the line-up the Courtesy Runner shall be the player who precedes her in the line up that is not on base.

The ASA Run Rule shall be in effect, 8 runs after 5 innings or 15 runs after 3 innings.

On Saturday and Sunday, games will be 90-minute drop dead time limit.

If time remains the international tiebreaker rule will be used beginning in the top of the eighth inning.

On Monday, after whatever inning is completed after 75 minutes, or at the top of the eighth inning, whichever comes first, the international tiebreaker shall be used REGARDLESS OF THE SCORE.

This will allow coaches to see players in these situations.

ALL GAMES MAY END IN A TIE.

Any protest must be resolved before the next pitch. The decision of the tournament Umpire in Chief or his designee shall be final.
